Packwood Court is located in beautiful West Wales in the township of Laugharne, home to Laugharne Castle and the famous poet, Dylan Thomas. We are ideally positioned to visit Carmarthenshire and Pembrokeshire Tourist attractions, including The Bonanic Gardens, Aberglasnes House and Garden as well as the beautiful Pembrokeshire coastline.

We are committed to preventing pollution from all our on site activities and to comply fully with all relevant environmental legislation. In our implementation of the Green Dragon Environment Standard we intend to set continual improvement objectives by which we can monitor the environmental performance of our business.

By implementing continual improvement we need to identify and address our primary environmental impacts. these include the use of now renewable energy resources, the materials provided for our guests comfort such as refreshments and food produce as well as the wastes produced by such use.

In trying to minimise our impacts we have designed and built a property that offers a very high standard of energy and resource efficiency. We have sourced reclaimed building materials in a conscious effort to maximise sustainability and ensure that the building sits perfectly within its setting. With energy efficient heating and lighting installed we have further progressed the ideal of sustainable, practical yet extremely comfortable accommodation.

Packwood Court is set in 6 acres of newly planted garden, which we hope will develop into a beautiful setting for our Guests, where they can enjoy a beautiful garden lunch during the summer months, although Packwood Court is open all year round. The produce which is also grown in the gardens are used in the delicious home-cooked meals and desserts. We also use local suppliers to provide good wholesome meat, vegetables and dairy products.
